

Per Pupil Expenditure is a metric that is often utilized to gain insight into the total costs for educating students in the district. The Per Pupil Expenditures, otherwise referred to as the Net Current Expenditures per Pupil (NCEP), are calculated by the state as defined in Connecticut General Statutes (C.G.S.) Section 10-261(a)(3). The formula takes all district educational expenditures and divides it by the state determined enrollment, which includes resident students educated in and out of district. The expenditures used in the calculation include all school operating expenditures from all sources, but does NOT include capital expenditures and debt service. The expenditure information for determining per pupil costs is taken from the Education Financial System (EFS). The figures used for the 2018-19 school year were released on October 18, 2019.

The graphs below illustrate PPE trending. PPE increases have been minimized over the years due to a variety of efforts to control costs. It is notable that Clinton has the second lowest PPE of all of the towns illustrated in the second graph.
