

Board of Education 2023-2024 Budget

Total Budget = \$38,772,877 *Increase of \$983,641 or 2.60%*

Represents the addition of \$200,000 back into the Board's operating budget as approved by Town Council at the Public Hearing on April 5, 2023

Operating Budget \$35,296,476

Includes all necessary funding to operate including salaries, benefits, materials, transportation and student activities.

Capital Budget \$570.566

Includes funding for computers and network upgrades, painting, projectors, floor coverings, furniture, doors, and fencing.

Debt Service \$2,905,835

Provides funding for payments on projects that were previously bonded such as new school buildings, roofs, and windows.
