- 5. Providing quality professional development and time for staff to explore, share, and embed new instructional approaches.
- 6. Continuing to develop and build capacity within the district to train and support students and staff.
- 7. Utilizing technology applications to better communicate with and enhance the connections among schools, staff, students, families, and the community.
- 8. Ensuring a collaborative approach to decision-making to explore and evaluate emerging technology applications and trends consistent with the Clinton Public Schools' vision and goals.
