# Budget and Finance Subcommittee:

# 2020-2021 Budget Public Forum - Tuesday, November 12 - Eliot Café

The Board of Education's Budget & Finance Subcommittee has scheduled a meeting for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 12, 2019</u> at 7:30 PM in the Eliot café to gather input to help the Board prioritize the 2020-2021 budget requests. This meeting will include a short presentation of the Board of Educations' budget process and timeline, the major considerations and factors that are incorporated into the decision-making regarding budget items, the current proposed Capital Expenditure Plan, and updated information about the major areas and trends that we are projecting will impact our budget request. Following the presentation, attendees will break into small groups to discuss, share and pose questions that can be recorded and shared with the Board of Education and administration as it begins to formulate the 2020-2021 school district budget. ### Policy Subcommittee: Revised Student Policies

The Board of Education has continued to revise and update <u>district policies</u>. This has been a major commitment and undertaking to review and revise the policy series to be aligned with current state and federal law. When the Board began this work last year, many policy series had not been updates in over 15 years. The Policy Subcommittee has worked diligently to review and update policy and to make appropriate decisions and changes to guide the work of the administration and ensure the appropriate management and oversight of the district. In our last newsletter, a link to our Annual Policy notifications was provided. Recently, several policies in the <u>5000 Series (Students)</u> were updated due to legal changes. For your convenience, the link included <u>here</u> will allow you to view a revised set of the policies shared at the start of the year that the Board is required to share annually.

# Buildings & Grounds Subcommittee

The Capital Expenditure Plan was developed within this subcommittee made up of Board of Education members, the Director of Buildings and Grounds, the Business Manager, and school administrators. This committee conducts an annual assessment of school facilities and identifies the needed equipment and maintenance repairs needed to ensure safe and updated facilities for optimum learning. A ten-year plan and a one-year proposal is developed, approved by the Board of Education and then submitted to the town for review and eventual approval. This year, the major projects include equipment replacement, a network upgrade project at Joel, a roof replacement of the Eliot Annex, and replacement of HVAC equipment in conjunction with the scheduled roof replacements. #### Public Relations Subcommittee

The subcommittee members have continued to examine efficiencies in communication and in the representation of the Clinton Public Schools as a whole to the school and local community. Continued areas of focus are the efficient and timely sharing of information through user-friendly systems and streamlining and reducing paper and forms for information. In addition, the Board has embarked on a rebranding initiative and utilizing money provided from a private source, has requested proposals, interviewed, and selected a professional graphic artist to work with the committee and school staff to unify our brand as one school community of Huskies. We will be sharing new designs, graphics, and color schemes to represent our schools and our district as a whole.

#### Instruction Subcommittee

Upcoming work of this subcommittee will include a review and approval of new graduation requirements, additional monitoring of Talented and Gifted programming and updates of the initiatives of our new TAG coordinator, and a continued focus on our development of our new and expanded courses at the middle school and high school, including ASPIRE, Computer Programming, 7th and 8th grade music, and AP Computer Science.
